We are very excited to be able to welcome students to IPoly High School for the 2022-2023 school year. In an effort to continue to maintain a safe environment for school staff and students, we would like to provide you with the most up to date information regarding practices and procedures we are putting in place to limit the spread of COVID-19 on our campus. All practices and procedures are in compliance with the recommendations in the most recent LA County Public Health Reopening Protocols for K-12 Schools.

## **SYMPTOMS CHECK BEFORE YOUR STUDENT COMES TO SCHOOL**

All students must respond to the Daily COVID-19 Symptom Check Survey they will receive every morning via their school emails before leaving for school each day. Your student will receive a green check mark if it is ok to go to school based on the survey response or your student will be asked to stay home and contact their doctor if the student answers yes to having symptoms or being around someone diagnosed with Covid-19. The survey responses will be sent directly to the Covid-19 Compliance Team on site and all results will be confidential. The student will need to show a green checkmark that presents on their screen to a school official in order to enter campus. ## **CURRENT TESTING REQUIREMENTS**

**Students that are not fully vaccinated ( Two weeks after completing your primary series) will be required to provide a negative covid test weekly. The test may be a PCR test done within the last 48 hours, or an antigen home test done within the last 24 hours. The student will be required to present a picture or screenshot of the negative test at the beginning of the school week.**

## **RESPONSE TO A CONFIRMED CASE OF COVID-19 ON CAMPUS**

Should there be a confirmed case of COVID-19 on campus, below you will find the steps IPoly will take to limit the spread of COVID-19 on campus. The steps below will be taken immediately upon notification of school officials (faculty, staff, student, or visitor) testing positive for COVID-19.

- There will be immediate separation of the case from the school community to self-isolation at home or to the school's designated isolations area, if notification occurs while the case is on site.
- We will begin performing immediate contact tracing in order to identify close contacts to the positive case. Close Contact Definition per LA County Public Health : Individuals who were within 6 feet of the infected person for 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period.
- There will be immediate closure of the exposed area in order to thoroughly clean and disinfect the area.
- The current LA County Guidelines do not require any students to quarantine as long as they are symptom free, regardless of vaccination status.
- - You will receive a notification letter stating that you were identified as a close contact and you will be given instructions based on the current LA County Public Health Guidelines.

## **FACE COVERINGS**

Cloth face coverings are strongly recommended to be worn by all staff and students while on campus. If a student is identified as a close contact they will be required to wear a high protective mask for 10 days after the exposure. Extra masks will be available to students on campus in the case that a new one is needed.
