10th Grade World History

Overview

Explore the concepts and impact of Enlightenment, French Revolution, Industrialization, Imperialism, the World Wars, Cold War, Developing Nations, and Modern Global Challenges. Class will be a mixture of many different teaching methods. Students will be expected to take notes during lecture, participate during debates/discussions, present when asked, listen when others present, engage in hands-on activities, be a good team member, and complete all necessary readings.

Goals

- Trace the rise of democratic ideas and how those ideas have shaped modern history.
- Develop an understanding of the historical roots of current world issues.
- The cause and course of global conflicts.
- Explore the impact of Industrialization and Imperialism and its lasting legacy.

Class Guidelines

- 1. Plagiarism and cheating have no place in a community of active learners. Have the confidence in yourself to give your original best.
- 2. Absent work from excused absences can be made up with no penalty. It is the student's responsibility to get any missing work and complete it in 3 school days. Absent work from unexcused absences or due to suspension may not be made up.
- 3. Late work or absent work turned in past the 3 days will be assessed lower than work turned in on time. Late work will not be accepted after the completion of the relevant course of study. For example, any late/missing work related from World War 2 must be turned in before the culminating test on World War 2.
- 4. Students are expected to read the text, learn from the lectures, and participate in activities.

Grading is done on a point system. Points are based on approximately 45 minutes of work = 10 points. The following are some examples of possible points that can be earned for assignments. I reserve the right to adjust where necessary.

- Class Presentations 20-40pts
- Project 200pts

The project is integrated into the class as an assignment/s never to exceed 25% of the points possible
